

> In Q3 2020, **£1.85bn** (£2.53bn) was invested in **241** (248) deals of over £0.5m by **327** (331) investors

> So far in 2020, **£6.2bn** (£6.4bn) was invested in **751** (802) deals

In Q3:

> The busiest investors were Crowdcube, The Future Fund, Seedrs, BGF, Enterprise Ireland, Mercia, Parkwalk and Seedcamp

> **68%** (72%) of deals involved more than one investor

> **43%** of deals were less than **£2m** in value

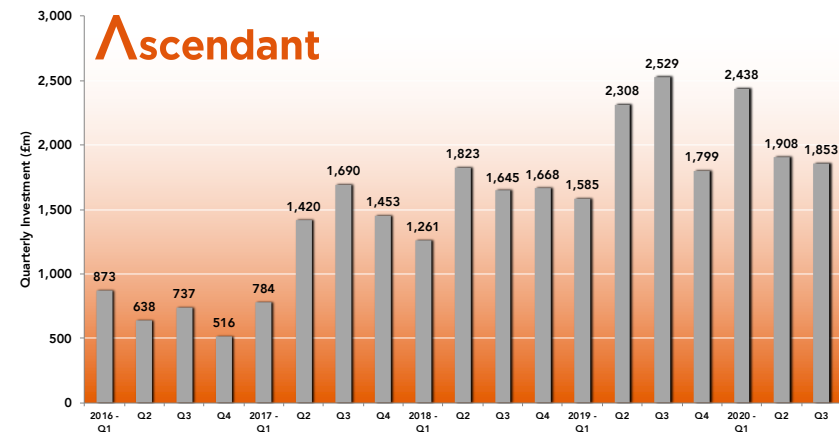
> Private investors participated in **32%** (34%) of deals

> Crowdfunding platforms financed **13%** (13%) of deals

> US investors participated in **16%** of deals, European investors in **17%** and Corporate Investors in **13%**

> There have been three primary areas of investment focus – Internet Services (**£941m**, **117 companies**), Software (**£525m**, **64 companies**) and Hardware (**£388m**, **60 companies**).

> The 10 biggest deals (with disclosed values) received **47%** (53%) of funds invested, were:

> The most active regions were London (**59%**) with Ireland, Scotland and The North all tied in 2nd place with **7%** of deals. London's share of the VC money was **78%** of the funds invested in the UK and Ireland.

> On a city by city basis, **143** London tech companies received VC, **12** in Cambridge, **12** in Edinburgh, **11** in Dublin and **7** in Oxford. All other cities or towns had 5 or less deals.
